Initial steps.....

- This is a journey, timing is everything
- Inspired a vision of Patient- and Family-Centered Care
 - Met with PMG leadership, explained the PFCC model and how it directly related to our Mission and Vision
 - Applied and was accepted for Patient Engagement Network Grant
 - Attended Institute for Patient- and Family-Centered Care conference



Next steps.....

- Recruited Patient & Family Advisors at Provider leadership meetings
- Hired Program Coordinator for IPFCC to develop program components (interviewing, on boarding, training, scheduling)
- Meet & Greet Luncheon for new Patient & Family Advisors and Leadership



Program Coord. Role

- Critically important role for the success of the Advisory Council – if it is important we need to invest resources to make it successful
- Continually support and encourage Patient & Family Advisors, acts as a supervisor, coach and mentor
- Manage logistics of meetings and PFCC work
- Keep in compliance with Providence Health & Services Volunteer policies and practices
- Continually spread the word about PFCC and the PFAC



Program Coord. Role continued

- Spread the word about the Patient & Family Advisory Council (meetings, publications, etc)
- Collaborate with departments and create opportunities to bring PFA's into meetings, programs, and projects
- Work with leadership to encourage participation in meetings and projects
